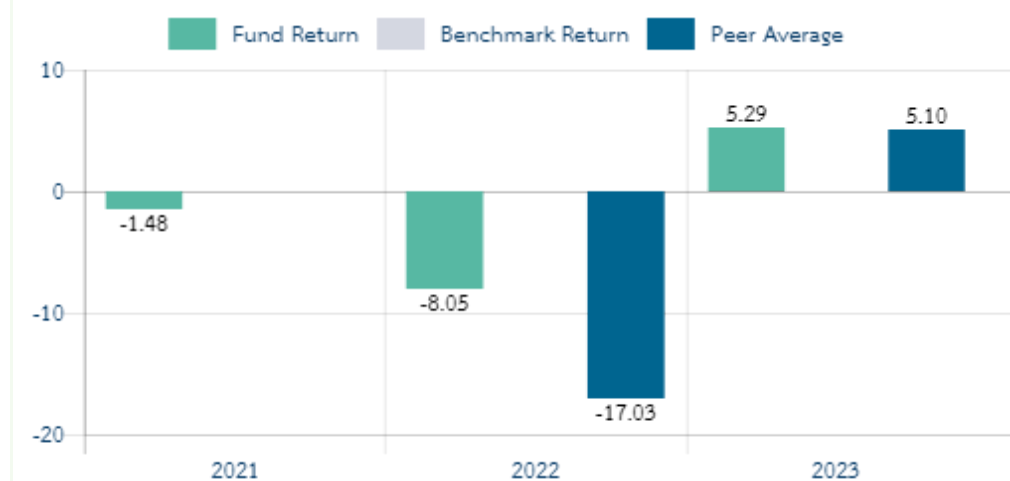

Investment Policy and Strategy

- The Fund was renamed from K-ALLROAD-UI on 19 January 2023.
- The Fund mainly invests in LO Funds – All Roads, Syst. NAV Hdg, (USD), I Class A (Master Fund) which invests in equities, sovereign and corporate credit (in both DMs and EMs) and commodities.
- The Master Fund seeks to generate steady performance over market cycles and aims to offer higher risk-adjusted returns while controlling risk. Its investment approach applies a systematic, liquid and transparent risk-based allocation methodology.
- The Fund will use derivatives to hedge against exchange rate risk at fund manager’s discretion.
- The Master Fund may use derivatives for Efficient Portfolio Management purpose (EPM) and as part of the investment strategy and the Fund may use derivatives for EPM. In case that prices of underlying assets are highly volatile or market moves adversely to the investments, the Fund could suffer a loss. However, investors will not bare any loss exceeding their initial investment.
- The Management Company of the Master Fund is Lombard Odier Funds (Europe) S.A.
- Seek to track performance of the Master Fund which applies active management strategy and Risk-based methodology to control overall risk.

Description

Maximum Drawdown is the percentage of the fund's maximum loss in the past 5 years (or since the fund's inception if it is launched for less than 5 years) which is measured from the highest NAV per unit to the lowest NAV per unit during such period. Maximum Drawdown is an indicator of the risk of loss from investing in the fund.

Recovering Period is the length of time that the fund takes in recovering from the point of maximum loss to earning back the initial investment.

FX Hedging is the percentage of foreign currency investment with FX hedging.

Portfolio Turnover Ratio (PTR) is the frequency of securities trading in the fund portfolio over a certain period, calculated by taking the lower value between the sum of the value of securities purchased and the sum of the value of securities sold of the fund in 1 year period divided by the average NAV in the same period.

A fund with high Portfolio Turnover Ratio indicates frequent securities trading by fund manager resulting in high trading costs. Therefore, it is necessary to compare with the performance of the fund in order to assess the worthiness of such securities trading.

Sharpe Ratio is the ratio between marginal return of the fund compared to investment risk, calculated from the difference between the fund's rate of return and risk-free rate compared to the fund's standard deviation. Sharpe Ratio reflects the additional return that the fund should earn to compensate risk. A fund with higher Sharpe Ratio is considered having superior investment management efficiency as it generates higher marginal return under the same risk level.

Alpha is the fund's excess return compared to the benchmark. High Alpha means the fund can generate higher return than the benchmark resulting from fund manager's efficiency in selecting securities or seeking appropriate market timing.

Beta is level and direction of change in return of securities in portfolio in comparison to market price change. Beta of less than 1 indicates that the change in return of securities in portfolio is less than the overall market. Beta of more than 1 indicates that the change in return of securities in portfolio is greater than the overall market.

Tracking Error is the efficiency of the fund to imitate its return to benchmark. Low Tracking Error means the fund is effective in generating return close to benchmark. High Tracking Error means the fund generates return more deviate from benchmark.

Yield to Maturity is the rate of return earned on a bond held to maturity, calculated from the interest expected to receive in the future over that bond duration and paid back principal discounted to the present value. It is used to measure return of fixed income funds by calculating the weighted average of Yield to Maturity of each bond that the fund invests. As Yield to Maturity has standard unit in percentage per annum, it can be used to compare the returns between fixed income funds that have an investment policy of holding bonds until maturity and similar investment characteristics.

1. K-ALLRD-UI-A(A) is a **High Risk or Complex Fund** so the Fund may differ from other plain funds. Since the Fund invests in the Master Fund using derivatives as part of investment strategy, for example, to apply long/short strategies and to leverage the portfolio. As a result, the Fund bears higher risk than other funds which directly invest in underlying assets.

2. Although using leverage can increase potential returns, it also increases exposure to risk when underlying assets are highly volatile or market circumstance adversely affects the value of investment. The cumulative effect of the use of leverage by the Master Fund could result in a substantial loss.
